Subject to such other conditions, warranties, and/or undertakings which may apply from time to time under any applicable law, REESE warrants with respect to each new REESE Machine sold by its accredited agents, that for a period of twelve months from the date of original retail sale, REESE will repair or replace free of charge any part found to be defective in factory materials or workmanship under normal use and operation within the United States of America, Canada, Australia and New Zealand provided that;

- 1. The Machine
  - a. Has been properly assembled and adjusted.
  - b. Has been properly used and operated within the capacity and operating limitations specified by the manufacturer thereof, and
  - c. Has been properly maintained and cared for.

- 2. This Warranty applies to a direct purchase from an authorised REESE dealer. If any defect or fault shall arise, such a purchaser must return the defective work or Machine to an authorised REESE Dealer within ten working days of such defect or fault arising.

#### **INTRODUCTION**


The Reese Multi-Stacker (RS280) is a purpose designed 3pt linkage machine built by Reese Agri for shifting and stacking. It can stack up to 3 bales high and can carry up to 1 tonne. Bale spikes come standard with the Multi-Stacker along with optional brackets so it can lift the Reese Bale Handler (RS2200).


The Reese Multi-Stacker is built with a heavy construction and quality parts to ensure long term reliability. To ensure correct operation, please read the instructions contained in this document carefully BEFORE attempting to use the Multi-Stacker, and refer to the assembly drawings for details on assembly and replacement parts.

All Reese Multi-Stackers are assembled and tested before delivery.






#### **ASSEMBLY**


Your machine will most likely be supplied partially disassembled. Use the following assembly instructions and drawings to help assembly the Reese Multi-Stacker correctly. There are several considerations that must be followed as listed below:


1. Attach ram onto the back from first (using the two narrow washers provided) ensuring the hose coupling is facing away from the frame and it is orientated correctly. Ensure hose faces upwards and feeds through the frame rather than under the frame.




3. Attach the two Horizontal Bars onto the

Front Frame.







2. Attach the Upper Arm first to the back frame (ensuring the 'elbow' is closer to the back frame than the front) and then to the hydraulic ram using the two thick spacers provided.



4. Attach the Front Frame onto the Upper Arm.

5. Attach the two Lower (Stabiliser) Arms to both the front and back frames ensuring the Reese labels are facing outward.





6. Insert and fasten the Bale Tines securely.

#### **OPERATION**

#### Hitching to the Tractor

- 1. Hitch the Multi-Stacker to the tractors 3-point linkage.
- 2. Adjust the linage arms as required to ensure the Multi-Stacker stands vertical. (It is recommended a hydraulic top link be used to ensure the stacker remains vertical during operation.)
- 3. Connect hydraulic hose to tractor.

#### Bale Handling

1. **IMPORTANT**: Only spike bales when spike bales when; (1) the ram is fully contracted (horizontal bars touch the Rear Frame) or (2) when the Lower Arms are horizontal as shown in the figures below. If you spike bales in any other positions you risk damaging the hydraulic ram.




Figure 1: Only spike bales when the Reese Multi-Stacker is in one of the two positions shown.

#### 2. Using the Reese RH2200 Bale Handlers

(You will need to purchase the Bale Handling Bracket Kit (Part # RS290)

- a. Remove the two tines from the Multi-Stacker.




Figure 2: Ensure brackets are welded between 660-750mm apart on the back frame of the RH2200 Bale Handler as to fit between the lugs on the Multi-Stacker frame.

- b. Weld the two brackets onto the back frame of the Bale Handler ensuring they are between 660-750mm apart as shown on Figure 2.
- c. Hook the Bale Handler onto the front frame of the Multi-Stacker ensuring the brackets fall between the attachment lugs.
- d. Insert Bent Pins as shown below.

NOTE: The RH2200 Bale Handler weighs 225kg therefore the maximum lift capacity is 1000kg.

#### STORAGE AND MAINTENANCE

#### **Parking**

- 1. Find an area of FLAT ground to park the Multi-Stacker on.
- 2. Place two large planks of wood on the ground behind the tractor.
- 3. Lower the back frame onto the wooden supports until the weight is removed from the lower linkage arms.
- 4. Drop the front frame down until it rests on the wood supports by reducing the hydraulic ram.
- 5. Disconnect the hydraulic hose and the three linkage points.

#### Greasing

The hydraulic ram should be greased top and bottom daily when in use. The bearings in the arm pivots are self-lubricating.
